## Questions To Consider When Working with Transfer Students

### **During the initial meeting:**

Questions to Ask

- 1) What was the reason you decided to transfer? Was this planned or unplanned?
- 2) Have you ever transferred before? If so, how was that experience for you?
- 3) Tell me about a time you experienced academic success at your previous college. Why was it a success? What did you do to make it a success? Who helped you?
  - a. How may you be able to utilize a similar strategy here?
- 4) How would you describe the previous school you transferred from?
- 5) Could you share some of the systems and offices that you used at your previous institution?
- 6) Describe what your ideal college life looks like. Why?
- 7) How are you feeling about your transfer to UNL? (positive, neutral, negative) (What are you excited/nervous about as you start here?)
- 8) What have been the biggest stressors for you as you have gone through the process of transferring?
- 9) What are you expecting about academics and classes here at UNL in comparison to your previous school?
- 10) How confident do you feel that you will be successful at UNL?
- 11) Is your intention to complete your degree here at UNL? What is the highest level of degree you are trying to earn?
- 12) What do you feel you will need here at UNL to be successful?
- 13) Talk about some of the people you feel you will need to reach out to in order to be successful?
- 14) Are you intending to work while you are here at UNL? If so, what systems do you have in place to continue to ensure your academic success?

### Questions to think about (not necessarily asked directly)

- 1) How much control did the student have in making the decision to transfer?
- 2) Is the reason (particularly for swirlers) for the move simple or complicated; that is, did it involve more considerations than a desire to take courses or declare a major not offered at the previous institution(s)?
- 3) How does the student's non-verbal communication match with their verbal responses? Are they congruent?

## Any meetings after a transfer student has started attending UNL:

Questions to Ask

- 1) How are you feeling about your transition so far to UNL? (positive, neutral, negative)
- 2) How big of a change has it been coming from your previous school to UNL?
- 3) How has it been finding your way around campus?
- 4) What or who have you used for assistance as you have been transitioning? What has that experience been like?
- 5) Do you feel you have changed in any way since transferring? **OR** Have you constructed a new identity of yourself? If so, how?
- 6) How have you gone about meeting new people and creating new friendships here? Has it been easy/ hard?
- 7) Talk about some of the ways you have gotten involved on campus so far?
- 8) Are there things or types of activities you are not currently involved in, that you were previously?
- 9) How are you feeling about where your grades are in your classes? How do they compare to your grades at your previous school?
  - a. If they are different, what have been some of the reasons you feel the grades are different?
- 10) Where do you tend to study? Do you study alone or with others?
- 11) Are there any areas about UNL (resources, deadlines, locations, etc), that are still confusing or complicated?

#### Questions to think about (not necessarily asked directly)

- 1) How has the transfer student's role changed as a result of transfer?
- 2) What stressors is the transfer student verbalizing? Are there particular resources I should be connecting them to?

## If Nothing Else, Ask these two questions:

- 1) What do you feel you need to be successful?
- 2) Who are some of the people you reach out to?
